

The following charts for easy understanding are based on my teaching entitled "The Hidden Message of First Timothy (TA16)." Everywhere the word *eusebio* or a form of *sabeo* is used, Rav Shaul was referring to Shabbat keeping, improperly translated "godly" or "godliness" in almost all translations. Hope you enjoy these charts.

"But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how oughtest to behave thyself in the house of Elohim, which is the *assembly* of the living Elohim, the pillar and ground of the truth." (1Tim.3: 15)
